

AH 538: Romanesque and Gothic Art

Students conduct advanced studies in Romanesque and Gothic architecture, sculpture, stained glass, and illuminated manuscripts from the 12th through the 15th centuries primarily in Western Europe. The course includes study of structural systems, iconographic programs, and patrons and artists, with an emphasis on primary historical sources.
