

Envs 301: Advanced Humanities and the Environment

This advanced interdisciplinary humanities course is designed to introduce students to thinking about the influence of the environment on human history and culture. Course content may include key concepts in environmental history, classics of environmental literature, theories of environmental philosophy and ethics, and ideas about the environment embedded in culture, religion, and the arts. Personal reflection as well as analysis of environmental questions will be encouraged. Students enrolled in Envs 301 will complete more advanced assignments on the course topics than students enrolled in Envs 101. Students who have already taken Envs 101 may not enroll in Envs 301.
